### **RE: *NCCI Claims Data Dashboard (CDD) Now Includes Minnesota***

The Board of Minnesota Workers' Compensation Insurers Association, Inc. (MWCIA) approved the inclusion of Minnesota data in ***NCCI Claims Data Dashboard (CDD)***. Authorized users of ***NCCI Claims Data Dashboard (CDD)*** can drill-down and benchmark Minnesota's data.

***NCCI CDD*** delivers medical cost and lost-time claims data benchmarking and visualizations for a customizable selection of states and industry sectors. The Medical Data Dashboard and Lost-Time Claim Data Dashboard pulls information from NCCI's Indemnity Data Call and Medical Data Call on a quarterly basis. To classify data into industries, ***CDD*** establishes a link to the policy data where possible. Industry sectors are defined using the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) super-sector. Average weekly wage data is further benchmarked against Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) data.

The visualization and benchmarking features in ***CDD*** allow analysis across five categories within the two dashboards.

#### Lost-Time Claim Data:

- Demographic information
- Life cycle of a claim
- Attorney involvement
- Benefit types
- Part of body, nature of injury, cause of injury and diagnosis

#### Medical Data

- Physician
- Hospital outpatient
- Hospital inpatient
- Ambulatory surgical centers
- Drugs

Data download and PDF report options are available.

Here are some highlights for Minnesota:

- For accident year 2022, the median total cost per lost-time claim that occurred within one year of tenure was at least \$6,200 lower than the median total cost per case for NCCI states.
- In accident year 2022, 38% of Minnesota lost-time claims received the first indemnity benefit within the first two weeks of injury compared to 23% of lost-time claims in NCCI states.
- In Minnesota, physical and general medicine comprised about 35% of claim counts compared to at least 41% in NCCI states for accident years 2015 – 2022.
- For accident years 2016 – 2022, the share of Minnesota claims with hospital outpatient visits steadily increased from 39% to 41%, while NCCI states observed a decrease from 39% to just under 35% for the same time period.
