Resource Spotlight ARROW: Analytical Report Resource on the Web

ARROW is designed to offer easy access to valuable workers' compensation data. By using ARROW, users create custom data pulls according to their needs for statewide (public) or carrier-specific (login required) information. To help users fully harness the power of this tool, the MWCIA offers several resources: user guide, reference guide, data dictionary, and online training.

What is ARROW? ARROW is the Analytical Report Resource on the Web. Key features of ARROW include:

• <u>Summarized Class Experience</u>: Users can view data for class(es) or industry group(s) for desired policy year and reports. Further, data can be viewed on a zip code, regional, or statewide basis. Information can further be parsed by premium ranges.

### Actuarial Department

- <u>Custom Historical Triangles</u>: Users can view data for class(es) or industry group(s) for desired injury type(s), part(s), nature(s), cause(s) by claim status(es). Further, data can be viewed on a zip code, regional, or statewide basis. Information can further be parsed by premium ranges.
- <u>Average Experience Mod</u>: View average experience mods by rating year, governing class code(s) or industry group(s). Further, data can be viewed on a zip code, regional, or statewide basis. Information can further be parsed by expected loss ranges.

#### Why Use ARROW?

- See how loss development compares between industry groups
- View claim closure patterns for different parts of body injured
- Compare losses across regions in Minnesotc
- Research workers' compensation class code experience
- Learn about the workers' compensation industry
